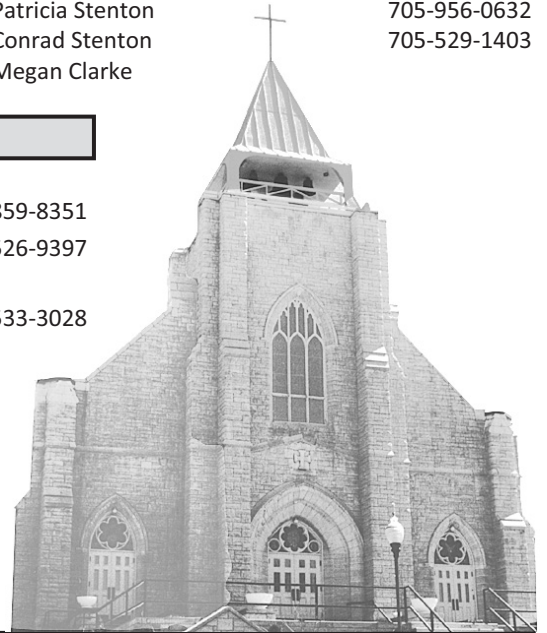

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. The day recalls Jesus' triumphal entry into the city of our salvation that takes place about a week before his Resurrection (Easter).

Why do we wave palms?

When Jesus rode into Jerusalem, crowds greeted him by waving palms and covering his path with small branches. We wave palms today to hail Christ in his triumph for our salvation in the light of his Paschal Mystery - his Passion, Death and Resurrection.

Jesus enters Jerusalem. The crowd of disciples accompanies him in festive mood, their garments are stretched out before him, there is talk of the miracles he has accomplished, and loud praises are heard:

"Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"
 (Luke 19:38)

On Palm Sunday, priests will wear red vestments in keeping with the Church's focus on the Lord's glorious Passion

Traditionally, before the beginning of Lent the following year, the palms are collected and burned to a fine ash. The ashes are blessed and used for the Ash Wednesday liturgy.

Holy Week

Today is Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. The ceremonies of Holy Week and the Easter Triduum are the most important and impressive of the liturgical year. We encourage parishioners to enter fully into the spirit of these sacred days by participating in the church's liturgy. We hope families will attend together, although we remind parents with babies and very young children that the Holy Week rites are longer than the average Sunday Mass.

Chrism Mass



Cardinal Thomas Collins, together with the bishops and priests of the diocese will celebrate the Chrism Mass at St. Michael's Cathedral on April 16th. At this Mass the oils to be used in the administration of the sacraments during the coming year will be solemnly blessed, and the clergy will renew their commitment to priestly service.

Paschal Triduum



The greatest mysteries of redemption are celebrated yearly by the Church beginning with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until Vespers on Easter Sunday. This time is called the "Triduum of the Crucified, Buried and Risen One"; or "Easter (Paschal) Triduum" because it celebrates the Paschal Mystery, that is, the passing of the Lord from this world to His Father. The Church, by the celebration of this mystery is united to Christ, her Spouse, in intimate communion.

The celebrations of the Triduum are:

The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper – April 18 – 7 pm

The Celebration of the Lord's Passion – April 19 – 3 pm

The Easter Vigil- April 20 – 8 pm

Paschal Fast

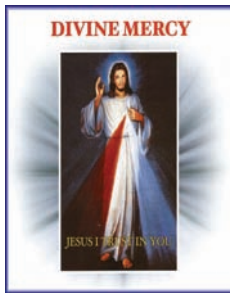
Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence.

According to the law of the Church, all Catholics ages 18-59 inclusive may eat only one full meal on Good Friday; the other two meals together are not to equal another full meal.

In addition, all Catholics over the age of 14 are to abstain from meat. This paschal fast should be continued on Holy Saturday so that the people of God will receive the joy of the Lord's resurrection with uplifted and responsive hearts.

Easter Vigil

According to a most ancient tradition, the Vigil celebrated on Holy Saturday to commemorate that holy night when the Lord rose from the dead, is regarded as the "mother of all holy vigils". The Church keeps vigil, waiting for the resurrection of the Lord and celebrates the sacraments of Christian initiation. From time immemorial, the Church has celebrated that annual Pasch, the solemnity of solemnities, above all by means of a night vigil. For the resurrection of Christ is the foundation of our faith and hope, and through Baptism and Confirmation we are inserted into the Paschal Mystery of Christ, dying, being buried and raised with Him, and with Him we hope to reign. The full meaning of this Vigil is a waiting for the coming of the Lord.
