

India is reeling from a devastating Archdiocese COVID-19 outbreak. In recent days, the country has been reporting more

than 400,000 of new cases and 4,000 deaths every 24 hours.

Reflection: Broken, Shared and Source of Blessing



A story is told of a woman who was diagnosed as having an advanced case of cancer and was projected to have six weeks to live. Instead of hiding in a corner and falling into depression, she started out a fundraising project to buy the latest medical equipment that can detect cancer at its earliest stage,

She became so preoccupied with the project that she forgot about her

cancer. Six weeks turned into six months, and she was not slowing down. Six months became six years, and she was still breathing and thriving. Eventually, she was discovered to have been completely healed of cancer.

The story did not end there. Among the people who benefited from the newly acquired medical apparatus were two men. The first one, upon knowing he had cancer, went about preparing for his funeral; the second continued to take care of his family in the most loving of ways. The first patient eventually died; the other survived.

When He ascended back to heaven, Jesus left his disciples with a task: *go into the all the world and proclaim the good news* (Mark 16: 15). The strategy was partly to prevent the disciples from wallowing in self-pity and so as not to dwell in negative thoughts and partly to let the whole world know what He has done.

We got all our personal concerns; everyone has problems in life. Yet no matter how serious we think our troubles are, there is always something more important we need to do. One reason why suffering could be dehumanizing is that it has a way of holding us back and preventing us from seeing life beyond our misery and further than ourselves. Far from belittling our worries, keeping our hearts open to being with and helping others could be ways of boosting our morale and strengthening our optimism.

Jesus knew that the disciples were still afraid and that their spirits were down. Yet, besides trying to console them, he also challenged them. He made them realize that they should not go back to their comfortable nests of indifference and hide in the cocoons of spiritual insignificance. The Lord is alive, and his resurrection should mean to us freedom from the shackles of suffering and liberation from the tyranny of self-centred living.

Besides being Ascension Sunday, today is also World Communications Sunday. Establishing the connection between the two occasions is important. Jesus' Ascension to heaven means he can now communicate fully to the Father the things that he saw and experienced on earth. He bids us to the same: to communicate with one another things

that we see and experience with the Lord, things that are beyond fears and pains, things that inspire us to continue to know, to love and to serve Him.

Death and the grave could not confine Christ Jesus. Also, in Him, with Him, and through Him, sickness and suffering can't hold us back. Fr. Roselle
