

We continue to pray for the 215 children who died in Kamloops and in residential schools throughout the country – they must not be forgotten. We all seek the truth and this tragic discovery provides yet another opportunity for us to learn more about this dark chapter in our history and the painful journey experienced by so many of our Indigenous brothers and sisters.

There is much more work to be done. Since the 1990's, many of the Catholic entities responsible for the operation of residential schools have apologized publicly for their actions and have journeyed together with victims on the path to truth and reconciliation. This includes the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, the religious order that operated the residential school in Kamloops, which over the weekend again apologized for its role in the residential school system. Pope Benedict XVI also had the chance to meet with Indigenous leaders in 2009 to personally express his sorrow and anguish. These actions do not erase our history; they acknowledge our past, force us to face the consequences of our behaviour and compel us to ensure that our sins are not repeated. Reflection for this weekend There Must be More

We are sorry, there is nothing more we can do. We have heard these familiar words from doctors, whether on medical television series or in real life. On TV, we dismiss the words as just part of the drama, said today and forgotten tomorrow. But when they are spoken to us as we keep vigil over a loved one hooked up to tubes and wires in intensive care unit, we protest. That cannot be. There must be something more that should be tried.

The Gospel story presents extraordinary happenings. First was the strong faith of Jairus, the young girl's father, a synagogue official: 'My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her so that she may be made well and live.



The second was the bleeding woman's courage in her desperation. Though considered impure and unclean in Jewish society and thus forbidden to touch others, she dared to come up

behind Jesus, 'If I but touch his clothes, I will be made well.' The third was the Lord's kindness in raising Jairus daughter back to life, "Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping... Little girl, get up!' And Jesus told them to give her something to eat.

Faith recognizes the limitations of the world and cannot change the reality of sickness and death. However, in life and in death, faith says, we belong to the Lord. Faith affirms that God is greater than any pain or suffering that this world imposes, that 'God did not make death, and he does not delight in the death of the living. For he created all things, the generative forces of the world are wholesome' (First Reading). Faith declares that God's riches are inexhaustible, especially in Jesus Christ who, though he was rich, for our sake became poor, so that by his poverty we might become rich (Second Reading).

When we hear the words, *nothing more can be done,* let us rejoice and know that God is with us in Jesus and God's power is greater than anything we can imagine. Let us hear Jesus say, *do not be afraid; just have faith.* That is the key – unwavering faith and complete confidence in Jesus who has power to give life.
