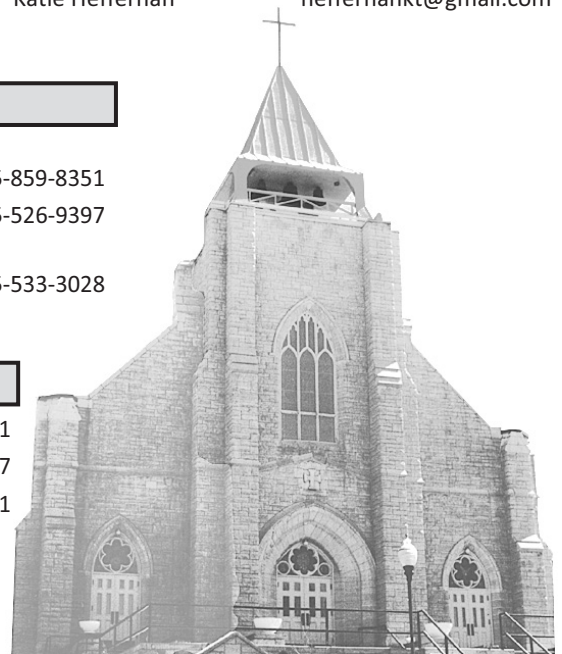

The Pope's Prayer Intention for July: Social Friendship

We pray that, in social, economic and political situations of conflict, we may be courageous and passionate architects of dialogue and friendship.

Reflection: Summoned & Sent



Jesus established his Church on the foundation of the twelve apostles. In our Gospel, Jesus sends out the Twelve on a mission and gives them specific instructions.

We naturally expect that since Jesus was thinking of a worldwide organization that is to last until the end of time, He would choose the best and most capable people of the world.

To our surprise, we realize that these were rugged and unlettered fishermen of Galilee, led by Simon. There is not much to expect from people who catch fish. But when it comes to the proclamation of the Gospel, there are five important lessons we can learn from fishermen. Just remember the letters P-E-R-T-H, the name of the town east of us: PERTH.

P – stands for patience. A fisherman cannot force or hurry the fish. He waits patiently for the fish to come. God has his appointed time to touch the hearts and minds of people. A bearer of the Good News must learn to be patient. There is no way of knowing what is going on in people's minds and hearts. We just have to continue talking about God, his kingdom and his teachings, and God, in his appointed time, will be the one to touch and lead them to conversion.

E – is for environment. The fisherman must know when and where to find the fish. He has to be in the proper environment, the right fishing area, the proper tide and time of the day or night, as well as lunar condition. The Gospel must be preached at the right time and place. It is absurd to preach to people who are sleepy or in a hurry. There are proper places, times and occasions conducive for preaching God's word. And if the people in a certain locality do not welcome God's messenger, he or she just has to 'shake the dust of his or her feet in testimony against them and move on to the next village.

R – stands for resolve, or courage and determination. Fishing is not only difficult but also hazardous. The sea, with its unpredictable waves and winds, can be very dangerous. Jesus gives this warning to his disciples when he sends them on mission: *Behold, I am sending you like sheep in the midst of wolves so be shrewd as serpents and simple as doves* (Matthew 10: 16).

Talking about God is also hazardous. There are many enemies of God and his Church out there who will destroy the messenger in order to stifle the message. But messengers, like fishermen, are to continue with firm courage and resolve to deliver the message of God's love and mercy even in the midst of turbulent waves and winds of opposition.

St. Paul gives us this encouragement: *If God is for us, who can be against us?* (Romans 8: 31). The virtue of trust in God is truly necessary. That is why Jesus instructs the twelve to take nothing for the journey so that they will not rely on what they have but have full trust and confidence in the power and grace of God.

T – is for the right technique or the skill to catch fish. Anyone who wants to catch fish must know what equipment to use: hook and line, traps or nets. And he or she should also know how to use them properly and effectively. Jesus used parables and common everyday examples, which people could easily relate to, and this was very effective. If He were around today, He would most probably use the modern tools of mass media as well as the effective techniques in communications.

H – stands for humility. The fisherman must always remain invisible to the fish. Otherwise, they will not come near. Such is the case in talking about God, his kingdom and his message. The central focus should always be Jesus and the disciple must remain invisible. We are to attract people to Christ, and not to ourselves. The entire ministry of John the Baptist is based on this virtue: Jesus must increase; we must decrease. Fr Roselle
