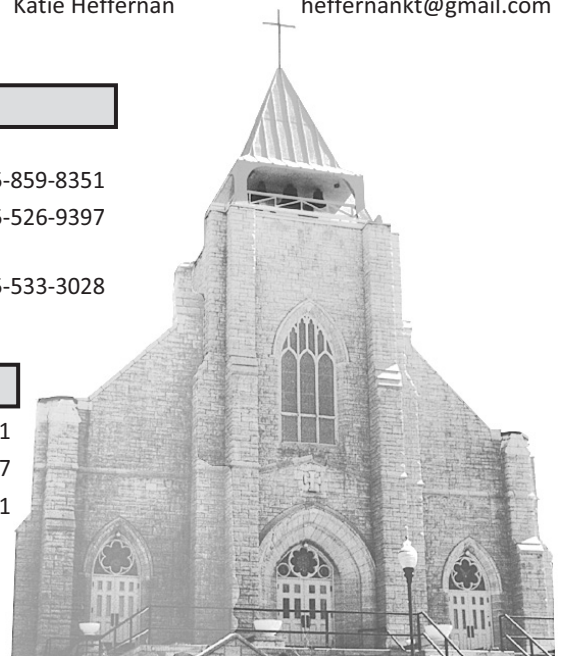

Reflection: Be It Ever So Humble

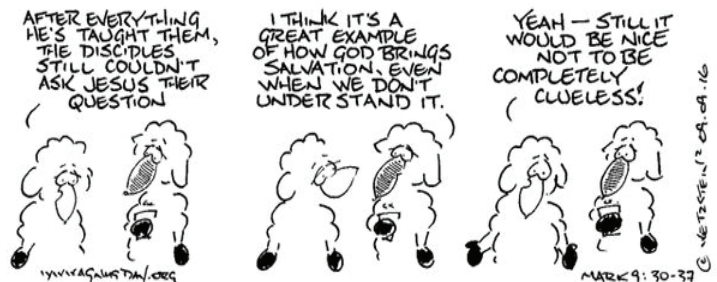
During a talk show interview with supposedly successful people, the host asked what led them to where they are now. One common answer: ambition. Without ambition, one is bound to be just average.

The gospel reading on this Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time is about ambition. Jesus, for the second time, reveals to his closest friends the Paschal mystery in its stark reality. They fail to accept it or perhaps they hesitate to do so because they were afraid of its corresponding demands. It is clear in the story the striking contrast between the self-immolation of Jesus with the selfish ambition of his disciples. Jesus offsets such misdirected desires with the ideal of humble service, symbolized in the simplicity and dependence of a child.

We may then ask at this point in our lives as to what our ambition? What do we desire to achieve now and in the future? Are all our energies spent for this? What have been our means to realize our dreams?

Such disposition and attitude are in clear contrast with Jesus' teaching. Perhaps that's the reason why he felt so disappointed with his apostles who were aspiring for who is the greatest. As an alternative, Jesus presents a child. A child humbly obeys without questioning and is content to be last of all.

It is all right to have ambitions but it might be good to ask where these are ultimately directed as well as the sins by which such ambitions are realized. Is it simply for one's personal glory that one is even willing to do everything even if it is immoral and unchristian only to be able to achieve one's goals in life? Or are we willing to consider the challenge of Christ of being servants of all, to be considered the least like a child? May we receive the grace of enlightenment and courage so that we will be able to truly heed the teaching of Christ. Fr. Roselle
