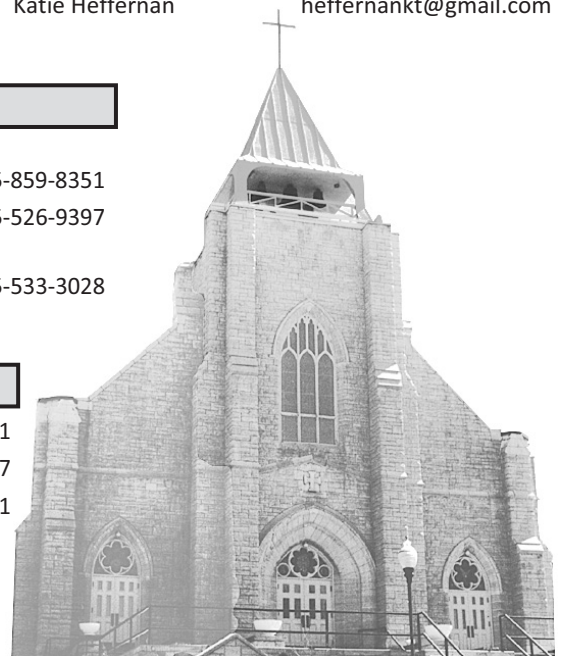

The Book of Remembrance

All Souls Day Indulgences

Visit to a Church or Oratory on All Souls Day. **PLENARY INDULGENCE.** A plenary indulgence, applicable **ONLY** to the souls in purgatory, may be obtained by those who, on All Souls Day, piously visit a church and recite one Our Father and one Creed.

Visit to a Cemetery. Only applicable to the souls in Purgatory when one devoutly visits and prays for the departed. A **PLENARY INDULGENCE** is bestowed for this work each day between November 1 and November 8.

To obtain an indulgence, you must pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, receive Holy Communion within days, and go to confession within weeks, and be free from attachment to sin (which isn't the same thing as not ever sinning) otherwise the indulgence becomes partial, which is still pretty good.

Reflection: **Portrait and Figures**

The Beatitudes, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, writes in his book *Jesus of Nazareth*, are the fruit of Jesus' gaze upon the disciples. They describe their actual condition: poor, hungry, weeping, hated and persecuted. Yet this situation in which Jesus sees his disciples becomes a promise when he looks on them in the light of the Father. The Beatitudes are paradoxes because the standards of the world are tuned upside down as soon as they are seen in terms of God's values.

Pope Emeritus Benedict explains: *It is precisely those who are poor in worldly terms, those thought as lost souls, who are truly fortunate ones, the blessed, who have every reason to rejoice and exult in the midst of their sufferings.* The Beatitudes are promises resplendent with the new image of the world, and of humanity inaugurated by Jesus, his transformation of values. *They are eschatological promises.*

Being eschatological, however, does not mean that the joy they proclaim applies exclusively to some infinitely remote future or the next world. When a person begins to live from God's perspective, something of the *eschaton* (end things) is already present.

The secret of the Beatitudes lies in is being a veiled interior biography of Jesus, a kind of portrait of his figure. Benedict refers to the gospel portrait of Jesus: *He who has no place to lay his head (Matthew 8: 20), he who can say, 'Come, to me... for I am meek and lowly of heart (Matthew 11: 28-29) is truly meek; he is the one who is pure of heart and so unceasingly beholds God. He who is the peacemaker; he is the one who suffers for God.*

The Beatitudes display the mystery of Christ himself. Behind them stands the figure of Christ, the man who is God. And so, as surely as the promises of the Beatitudes are realized in him, he will make sure they are realized on those who live this option – all for the glory of God.

On November 1st, the Solemnity of All Saints, we celebrate the men and women of all time who were portraits of Jesus in their own lifetime. Living the spirit of the Beatitudes, they realized the promises of the Beatitudes. The saints are the 'cloud of witnesses' who spur us to follow their example of faithfulness and loving service.
