

Heaven on Earth (Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22)

One expression that my priest-friends and I often say when we gather together is: 'The world has a Savior. His name is not Roselle' (or John or Luis). This may sound trite, but in fact, it is profound. It is important to know where one stands in life. A person may excel in something in life, but that does not mean that one is already the totality of perfection. John the Baptist was fully aware of this fact. He gained respect and popularity as he called people to direct their focus on God. He also was clear and quick to say that he is not the Messiah.

Do my achievements in life give me a sense of fulfillment? Do they also help me more aware that I am an instrument of God to further build his kingdom?

John the Baptist perked up the people's expectations for the coming of the Messiah. Consequently, new hope and enthusiasm was awakened among the people. This scenario helps me understand the meaning of my own Baptism. The graces I received in Baptism help me go beyond my present struggles and inspire me to believe that the efforts I exert in the present will result to, as St. Mother Theresa said and lived, 'something beautiful for God'. My Baptism empowers me to work out a future. Do I know the date of my Baptism? Do I value this great Sacrament? What can help me appreciate and live better the Sacrament of Baptism I had received?

At the Jordan, Jesus continued to pray after his Baptism by john. It was during that moment of prayer that He realized the proximity and presence of the Divine: heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended in the form of a dove, and a voice from heaven confirmed his identity.

When heaven opens to someone who prays, two things happen: awareness of the divine presence in what exists around (Luke 3: 22a) and awareness of the divine presence within oneself (Luke 3: 22b). The alternate Old Testament Reading for this Feast from Isaiah 42 already pointed out to this. The person who becomes aware of the divine presence within oneself discovers one's inner capacity only to manifest this: dignified in word (Isaiah 42:2) and deed (Isaiah 42 3) and considerate in his/her dealings (Isaiah 42: 4).

As we celebrate the Feast of our Lord's Baptism by John at the Jordan, let us continue to be fervent in our prayers. Let us allow the Holy Spirit to work in and through us. In this way, we will bring about the realization of the will of God in our time and world (Isaiah 42: 7). Indeed, Jesus is our Savior. And he commissioned us at our baptisms to be his instruments of charity and mercy.
