

The Pope's Prayer Intention for March

A Christian Response to Bioethical Challenges

We pray for Christians facing new bioethical challenges; may they continue to defend the dignity of all human life with prayer and action.

Reflection: To Truly Lift A Mask

Temptations are part of our human condition. At certain points in our lives, we have been enticed or lured into committing sin. Our Gospel on this First Sunday of Lent tells us that Christ himself was tempted, not once, but three times. In all these instances, Christ came out triumphant.

The object of temptation is usually something that appears and seems to be delightful. It is for this reason that temptations are able to entice or lure people into committing sin. Temptations seem to be good and easy to accomplish. Command this stone to become bread, and you will have food for your empty stomach. Worship me, and you will have all the power and glory of the kingdoms of the earth. Throw yourself down from this parapet and you will prove to everybody that you are the Son of God.

Temptations present themselves to us as something delightful and desirable to do: cheat and you don't have to study hard. Forget about the poor and the needy, and you will have more resources for your own pleasure and satisfaction. Don't tell the truth and you get out of a difficult situation unscathed. Blame other people and your own failings will be overlooked. Be unfaithful to your partner and you will have all the fun and thrill of your life.

The fact that Christ himself is tempted indicates to us that there is no moral fault in being tempted. The problem is the willful consent to temptation. Jesus is able to overcome the temptation by remaining steadfast in his resistance.

Jesus also shows us further the way on how to undermine and remove the appeal of temptation, namely, unmask temptation's lie. That is what Jesus does at every turn that the devil tempts him. The Catechism of the Catholic Church stresses the need for discernment that unmasks the lie of temptation 'whose object appears to be good', 'a delight to the eyes', and desirable, when in reality its fruit is death (n. 2847).

As we begin our Lenten journey, we are to ask ourselves: will we allow ourselves to be carried by our desires of our bodily appetites and the basic instinct of our emotions or will we take the test of character by heeding the higher call of the Holy Spirit towards deeper prayer, meaningful sacrifice and loving Christ more than ourselves?
