## **Be True to Yourself**

Justice, according to the Greek Philosopher Plato, is minding one's business. The Chinese sage, Confucius, calls it the rectification of names, so that the prince is to act as a prince, a civic ruler as a civic ruler, a parent as a parent and the child as a child. A teacher who does not teach does not deserve to be called 'teacher', nor the disciple who does not listen and obey the master does not deserve to called a disciple. If salt is to be salt, it should be salty. And a lamp is not truly lamp unless it is lighted and its light spreads through space and brightens the environment.

What is a human being if he or she is not humane? If one does not treat another as one wants oneself to be treated? So, the prophet Isaiah in the First Reading this Sunday enjoins us to share our bread with the hungry, welcome the homeless, and not turn our back on our relatives. This is what Pope Francis calls mercy. Mercy is another word for that light that shines in darkness, that renews the face of the earth, that makes everything new.

Jesus surprises us. We are scolded if we are proud or vain and yet he says that others must see our good deeds. If our minds and hearts are constantly evangelized by the gospel message, our good deeds need not be prideful or vain but will proclaim the essential truth of God's saving power. As Saint Irenaeus said, "The glory of God is man fully alive!" Let us be alive with Christ so as to proudly evangelize souls for God's glory.

Lord Jesus, implant in my heart a deep conviction of your saving grace present through faith in you. Let my daily actions incarnate living faith so I may be salt and light for others and you may be glorified by my good deeds.
