The Pope's Prayer Intention for August

For World Youth Day

We pray the World Youth Day in Lisbon has helped young people to live and witness the Gospel in their own lives.

Stewardship is Key

It is a special moment for the apostles. Particularly Peter, who, through the revelation and inspiration of God, is able to utter the truth about Jesus, the longawaited Messiah. And although Peter's understanding of the implications of that reality is not thorough, (which will become evident later on), he is nonetheless handed over some mission by Jesus when he said these words: "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

There are various interpretations of this mission given to Peter. "Binding and loosing" was a rabbinical expression for the authority to impose or to release from legal obligations. The meaning of the "keys" is found in the First Reading this Sunday from the prophet Isaiah: The "master of the palace" had complete authority over the king's household, second only to the king. He wore a key on a sash over his shoulder as a sign of his authority.

To have the "keys of the kingdom of heaven," therefore, means to have authority second to that of Jesus Christ. When Jesus entrusts to Peter the keys of the kingdom of Heaven, it becomes clear that Jesus takes the risk in assigning Peter this great responsibility with regard to the Church that Jesus wants to establish.

We are likewise given responsibilities and missions of authority by Jesus though not as directly as he did to Peter. At baptism, the priest or deacon reminds parents and the godparents of their task and commitment of raising the baptized child in imitation of Jesus. These children are gifts to be handled with care and love.

What authority has been given to you? As a teacher, you have the responsibility and authority to educate young minds for them to be able to make the right decisions as adults. As a doctor, you have the authority and responsibility of bringing comfort and healing to anyone, be it physiological, psychological or

emotional healing. Priests have the authority and responsibility of reconciling people among themselves and with God, of fostering unity and deepening faith, of nurturing hope and bringing love.

The Reading this Sunday prompts us to ask ourselves if we have been faithful to the authority and responsibility entrusted to us, or if we have betrayed such trust through our misuse of power and authority.

In the end, it becomes clear that such authority in having these responsibilities is rooted in the theme of stewardship. We shall be held accountable for whatever tasks and responsibilities lovingly given to us by Jesus. We pray that we will not disappoint our Lord Jesus.
