The Pope's Prayer Intention for December

Who Joy Is

The Third Sunday of Advent is also known as Gaudete Sunday: Gaudete means "Rejoice"! This reminds us that in the midst of our waiting and anticipation for the coming of the Lord we are to be joyful.

And so, we reflect on what it is to be joyful: Where is joy found? Our instinct tells us that true joy is everlasting and eternal. However, our personal experiences suggest otherwise: joy can be fleeting. For instance, we may wish to save money in order to purchase a new pair of shoes or to have the latest smartphone: there is excitement to wear a new pair of sneakers, or to have a new phone. However, after some time, our liking wavers and we wish for betterlooking shoes and more advanced phone.

So, we ask ourselves, "Where do we find our joy? Where do we find lasting joy?" As we read the Gospel reading about the ministry of John the Baptist we may wonder, what is so joyful about this man from the wilderness, preaching repentance for sins and conversion. What is so joyful about repentance and conversion?

We may have simply equated joy with excitement or contentment; true joy should be more than that.

Where is true joy to be found? John came out of the wilderness to be *a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him.* John came as *the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord.'* John came to introduce us to the Light which will bring us true joy. And Jesus can only fully enter into a heart that is contrite and humble.

Let us pray that, like John, we may be faithful in witnessing and testifying for Christ. May we grow more and more in this commitment so that we may find true and lasting joy in Christ.
