

The Pope's Prayer Intention for January 2024

For the gift of diversity in the Church

We pray that the Holy Spirit may help us to recognize the gift of different charisms within the Christian community and to discover the richness of different traditions and rituals in the Catholic church.

Come and See

Among my cherished memories in high school and university seminary were the times when classmates would invite us to their homes – to celebrate a birthday or Feast Day of the Patron Saint of a home village, or simply to enjoy the fruits in season in their backyard. In doing so, we not only filled our bellies but also came to know more about our host-fellow seminarians and their families. In turn, I would invite some of my classmates and friends to our home, especially during the feast day of my town's Patron Saint – St. Vincent de Ferrer.

Jesus' invitation to the first disciples – *Come and see* – has become formulaic for vocations promotion. It is Jesus' response to the curiosity of Andrew and his companion, asking him, "*Rabbi, where are you staying?*" What happens that afternoon, what Jesus shows them, what Jesus offers them – we don't know. We are told that *they remained with him that day*. In other translations, the word used is *stayed*.

The Greek verb *meno* (*to stay*) is a very Johannine verb that means more than simply *staying* or being physically in place. It means spending time and sharing life with another person. As a result, each one is enriched and knows the other person better. This reminds us of John 15 where Jesus likens himself to the *vine* and his disciples to the *branches* that must *remain* in the vine to survive and to flourish.

One of the apparent maladies of our time is the weakening of commitment among friends, among spouses, of people towards their community, of believers towards their God. Many find it difficult to stay, to remain and to be committed. Everyone seems to be shifting around or drifting apart dramatically. As a result, the 'roots' of relationships do not deepen; they become superficial and weak.

There was a time in my seminary days – before the age of cellphone and internet – when seminarians would find time to gather in the recreational rooms, basketball courts or communal patios and simply 'waste time' with one another. Towards the end of my seminary years, we sometimes tended to rush back to our rooms after meals to 'waste time' with our

computers and cellphones. There were fewer times for personal conversations, for sharing of life – things that were (and still are) essential to our human formation.

Jesus shows us in the gospel this Sunday (John 1: 35-42) that part of being truly human is spending time with family members and friends. Let us continue to treasure family members, strengthen our bonds, and be surprised and delighted by each other's growth.

Here too, in our parish, let us remain involved in our various ministries, take part in our different activities and be in touch with, or actually visit fellow parishioners, especially the sick and the homebound. May we not lose sight of this valuable human experience so as to be rooted in one another and in God.
