

### Grace, Peace and Joy Be with You!

Peace in the Bible is rich in meaning. In the Old Testament, a person who is at peace is happy, has many descendants and friends, has fruitful harvest, and sleeps without fear. For the Israelites, there is more to peace than simply a good relationship nature, with oneself, or with others. True peace means a right relationship with God, because the Lord God is peace (Judges 6: 24).

Jesus imparts true abiding peace to the disciples on the day of Pentecost. It is his peace that casts away the disciples' fear and brings joy into their lives once again. His promise to send them the Holy Spirit and to be with them always is now fulfilled. Not only does his peace give joy and unlock the doors closed by fear; it also brings freedom.

Jesus, our Lord, who comes on a mission from the Father receives the Holy Spirit and fulfills his mission. As he leaves to go back to the Father, he entrusts his mission to us, his disciples. Now, it is our turn to receive the Holy Spirit that we may discharge our mission.

Pentecost opens a new dimension in the life of the Church. With the peace of Jesus, communion with the Holy Trinity becomes possible. The gift of peace breaks the barriers of disunity and leads to the fulfillment of Christ's promise to share the life of God with all believers. The Holy Spirit brings together all humanity.

The Holy Spirit brings us the gift of peace (CCC 736). We cannot possess this peace on our own. It is a state of being. The Spirit's peace dwells in our heart, only if we nurture and protect it. God's peace does not mean we won't suffer noise, challenges, catastrophes, or anger. His peace does not ensure shelter from life's storms; it is a safe haven in the eye of a storm. This peace

allows us to rise above trespasses against us. It brings us contentment when no one praises us. It mollifies our anger when others despise us. The peace of God is not of this world (Philippians 4:6), but we certainly don't want to live in this world without it!

Come Holy Spirit, fill my heart with the fire of your love. Renew me in faith, hope, and charity to further God's kingdom on earth. Be my comfort and guidance. Amen.
