

Baby Steps at a Time

We have a life lesson to learn through the parable of the mustard seed (Mark 4: 26-34). It seems that what life intends to be great, it first makes it small. Perhaps that is where we go wrong. We are too impressed by the large. We tend to despise or ignore the small.

Yet look at the atom. It is the smallest unit of matter, yet what energy it contains!

Many great things and undertakings begin in small and hidden ways. For example, a building begins with one brick on another, a book begins with one word on a page, a journey begins with a single step, a forest fire with a single spark, a giant oak with an acorn, a huge river from a tiny spring, a lifelong friendship from a chance encounter. Things that have a certain integrity and truth always seem to start from humble beginnings.

Hence the importance of beginnings, of taking care of things in their beginnings. If you wish the adult to turn out well, then take a good care of the child. We sometimes ignore the small at our peril. The treacheries such as the breaking of a relationship do not begin in a dramatic way. They begin unostentatiously with a small resentment but take their disastrous toll in the end.

We ascend the heights or sink into the depths a step at a time. The true savour of life is not to be gained from big things but from little ones. Bad habits and illness creep up on us slowly and in little steps. The first step was of no seeming consequence. The roof leaks for want of a handful of thatch. Alcoholism takes hold of a person a glass at a time.

Just because we may not be able to do a mile today, it should not stop us from going a yard. Great things are not done by impulse, but by a series of small steps taken over a period of time. Our lives are made up of little things — little deeds, little happenings and so on.

If there is something which we want to do, let us not hesitate and think too much. Let us make a start, however small and seem insignificant. Let us take one step. Let us plant one seed. The only thing that accumulates in the long run is the meagre work of every day.


A Father's Prayer


