

The Pope's Prayer Intention for October For a shared mission

We pray that the Church continue to sustain in all ways a Synodal lifestyle, as a sign of co-responsibility, promoting the participation, the communion and the mission shared among priests, religious and lay people.

Be It Ever So Adored

In answer to the question of the Pharisees regarding the legality of divorce, Jesus quotes a passage from the Genesis story: 'For this reason, a man shall leave his father and mother...' then adds: 'Therefore what God has joined together, let no one put asunder.' What Jesus meant is that God enters into the lives of married man and woman, and He stays with them as long as they allow Him to be present in their married life. Marriage is an awesome reality in the Catholic tradition. Of the seven sacraments, it is only the sacrament of marriage where a priest is not the celebrant: the husband and wife are the celebrants. This means that when they say 'yes', each will give to the other not only themselves; each will channel to the Infinite Other, God. He will never be far from them. He will always be there for them in good times and in bad. God will be faithful to them. This ceremony is a solemn pledge of his presence and faithfulness in their marital life. But God's presence can never be one-sided. The husband and wife have to be present to God. He must be real to them as they are real to each other. If He is, then the odds are in their favor, or rather, his blessing and guidance will everreadily be showered upon them.

Jesus taught us how to make God the Father present in our lives – by living on in his love. We life on in his love if we keep his commandments just as Jesus kept the Father's commandments and live on in the Father's love. And Jesus continues: 'This is my commandment; love one another as I have loved you. If you have this love, then, the Father and I will dwell in you and make our home in you.'

Here we have the formula and the secret of a joyful and lasting marriage – a love patterned according to Jesus' love for us, a love that was ready to give up one's life out of love for the other. It is not the kind of unrealistic and sugar-coated love presented to us by popular media. There 'love' is characterized by the electricity of companionship and a nice feeling towards the other. These are not essential in love because they inevitably disappear in time. Those who have been married already for some time will surely bear this out.

St. Paul, in his first letter to the Corinthians, names the down-to-earth qualities of love that is modeled according to God: love is patient and kind; it is not jealous or conceited; it is not selfish or irritable; it does not keep a record of wrongs. No marriage without these qualities described by St. Paul will ever last.
