Let us pray that through work, each person might find fulfilment, families might be sustained in dignity, and that society might be humanized.

Roll, Rise, and be Renewed

It was Easter Sunday, the day of the Resurrection. But for Peter and the disciples, it was like an extension of Good Friday. Peter and the disciples were discouraged and disappointed. Their dreams were shattered, their hopes crushed. Their master had died an ignominious death on the cross. After all, there was nothing to the great dreams of their Master. It was all finished. And so, they were going fishing, turning to their former way of life. They had given up on their master.

And then, a stranger entered their lives. An unknown bystander on the shore by the Sea of Tiberias. They let him into their lives, answering his questions and responding to their suggestion to cast their net on the 'other' side of the boat. So, they cast their net and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. And then, they recognized their Master.

They saw the 'other' face of Christ – not the familiar face of the earthly Jesus, but the unfamiliar face of the risen Lord. And everything changed, a turnaround from being fishers of people, from the labor of fishing to the mission of witnessing to the resurrection. The message of the Resurrection is that Jesus never gives up on his disciples. Despite their denial, betrayal and abandonment, Jesus returns to them and takes them back again. He calls them a second time and restores them to their status as disciples.

The transformation wrought by the Resurrection was not just a reality for Jesus, but as for the disciples as well. Like Jesus, they had risen from the dead – from discouragement and disappointments to new hope and excitement at the mission of witnessing to the Gospel.

This is true as well for us, today's disciple of the Lord Jesus. Despite our unfaithfulness, wickedness and indifference, Jesus never gives up on us. He calls us, not just once, but a second time, a third time, several times, all the time.

And fascinatingly, often his call comes to us *through the stranger*. It is interesting to note that the risen Lord is often mistaken as a stranger – as the gardener by the tomb, as the stranger on the road to Emmaus, as a bystander by the Sea of Tiberias. For indeed, with

the stranger lies surprise: a new possibility, contact with that part of God and of reality that we have never experienced before. That is why the stranger can lead us to experience the newness of the Resurrection.

May Easter inspire us to roll away the stones we have built and allow our Risen Lord to renew us.

ABOUT ST. MICHAEL'S CHOIR SCHOOL

Founded in 1937 with the purpose of providing sacred music for services at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica in downtown Toronto, St. Michael's Choir School is a centre for musical and academic excellence. SMCS is one of only six choir schools in the world affiliated with the Pontifical Institute of Sacred Music in Rome. Each boy admitted to SMCS is trained in vocal and instrumental music and sings in at least one of the school's many choirs. In addition to the annual Christmas concert, the choirs of SMCS tour regularly and perform at many local events. Balancing the sacred and the secular is customary for the school. St. Michael's Choir School is not only renowned for its music program, but also for its academic achievement, consistently ranking at the top of Fraser Institute surveys. For 88 years, graduates of SMCS have pursued studies in science, education, medicine, law, business and, of course, music. The last category includes such well known musical artists as Michael Colvin, Stewart Goodyear, Kevin Hearn, John McDermott, Claude Morrison, Robert Pomakov, Michael Shade, Stephen Hegedus, Matt Dusk, Andrew Craig, Joshua Tamayo, Jordan DeSouza, and the late Michael Burgess, to name a few.


