# Pope's Prayer Intention for June

That the world might grow in compassion

Let us pray that each one of us might find consolation in a personal relationship with Jesus, and from his Heart, learn to have compassion on the world.

# **Celebrate, Pray and Live**

Today we celebrate the greatest mystery of our faith, the mystery of the Holy Trinity. We would not know anything about the Holy Trinity if God had not revealed it to us. The mystery is this: that God is father, Son and Spirit. It is not so much something to talk about, for words are totally inadequate; instead, it is something that we should celebrate, pray and live.

Today is not a day for deep theological reflection. It is a day to keep things simple. Perhaps it is far better on this day to invite ourselves to gaze briefly into the mystery of God, than to plunge ourselves into deep theology that leave us confused and lost. A story may help.

A farmer went into the city. He was walking down a busy street when he suddenly stopped and said to his friend beside him, "I can hear the droning sound of a bee or insect." The friend was amazed and asked, "How can you hear the sound of an insect in the midst of all this noise and confusion in the street?" "I can hear it because my ears are attuned to its sound," he replied. Then the farmer listened even more intently, and following the sound, found the insect, which was caught in a spider's web in the ledge of a window.

His friend could not get over this. But the farmer showed no great surprise. Instead, he took a few coins out of his pocket and dropped them on the sidewalk. On hearing the sound of falling coins, all the passersby stopped in their tracks. "You see what I mean," said the farmer, "None of those people could hear the sound of that insect, but all of them could hear the sound of coins falling on the sidewalk in spite of the sounds in the street. People hear what their ears are attuned to hear, and ignore, or miss, all the rest."

The point being made here is again very obvious. It is natural to admit the existence of God as soon as we open our eyes. Yet many look and see nothing. They listen and hear nothing. We have to be attuned to hear and see God. This calls for great openness and sensitivity on our part. But the best thing a Christian can do is to look at the Gospels. In other words, we have to look at how Jesus spoke about this mystery of the Holy Trinity and lived it.

He spoke about God as a merciful and forgiving Father. He spoke about himself as the Son of the Father, who came to save us by dying for us on the cross. And by seeking to do the will of the Father at all times, he showed us how a child of God should live. The will of the Father was that he should bring us the good news of

salvation. But it was the Holy Spirit who commissioned him for this work. He said: "The Spirit of the Lord has been given to me. He sent me to bring good news to the poor."

We are dealing with a great mystery, yet anyone can grasp it in such a way as to be able to pray about it and live out this mystery in our daily life. We think of God as our Father, a Father who loves us deeply. It is from him we come, and it is to him that our lives flow like a river towards the sea. We think of Jesus, the Son of God, as our Brother who died that we might live. He leads us to the Father's house. We think of the Holy Spirit as the one who helps us to live like Jesus and who binds us together as brothers and sisters in a community of love. Like fish in the sea and birds in the air, this becomes the very atmosphere in which a Christian prays and lives. Now, how do we live out this mystery of the Holy Trinity in our daily lives? In our world full of ups and downs, all of us, need special trust in the Father. Like the birds of the air, we too are not always sure what the future has in store for us. We too need to trust that our heavenly Father will provide. In a world of selfishness and selfcenteredness, we need to follow the example of Jesus' self-sacrificing love. In a world of conflicting voices and ideas, we need the guidance of the Holy Spirit. There are so many times when we honestly don't know what is right. There are also times when we don't know what is the best way to handle some situation. It is during times like these that we need to pause in prayer and listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit.

Trusting in the Father, following in the footsteps of his Son Jesus Christ and listening to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, these are the ways of bringing the Holy Trinity into the nitty-gritty of our daily lives. And after all, at a practical level, this is what the Feast of the Holy Trinity is all about. It is the celebration of the great mystery that God is our Father whom we can trust; that Jesus Christ is our Brother whom we can follow and, that the Holy Spirit is our constant companion whom we can always turn to for guidance.




