Wavelengths

It is funny how quickly the seasons can turn. One week we are baking in the sun and the next week it is time for sweaters and jackets. There are subtle (and not so subtle) hints in the trees of leaves beginning their transformation, and to be honest, the gardens themselves seem tired after a long summer show. The seasons keep on spinning. It is one of my favorite times of the year because it means that fresh-off-the-tree apples are ready.

There is nothing better than a juicy MacIntosh apple to welcome the autumn. It always sparks a flood of memories growing up. These early days of September meant that we would hike over to my aunts' farm. They were actually my dad's aunts, but we just called them our aunts. They didn't work the farm anymore, they just rented the fields, but there was still an orchard with mostly apples and some pear trees. My old aunts would join us in the orchard as we filled buckets and baskets and bags with apples. My aunts wanted to be known as eccentric, but in reality, they were just quirky. The rule was that you could only pick apples that had fallen to the ground. It was crazy, and when they had their backs turned, branches got whacked or shaken to get the freshest apples. They had long since stopped treating the trees so there were lots of scabs and worms.

It was a sad day when the orchard was taken down. The trunks were wonderfully gnarly, filled with Norman Rockwell character, and they had likely been there for over a century, planted when they first started farming the land. The farm was always the place of family gatherings: Christmas, Mothers' Day, Easter, Thanksgiving and my aunt's birthday in July. In fact, we were gathered around their discoloured colour television watching the first moonwalk in 1969. One of my earliest memories was sitting in the farmhouse with my great grandfather by the fireplace. Anyway, we would take the apples home and spend the whole next day, peeling apples, stirring apple sauce, bottling apple jelly, and stewing apple butter. The house was filled with the aroma of cinnamon, allspice and cooked apples for days, and the best bottles were set aside for Christmas gifts.

Back in the day, when peanut butter was allowed as school lunches, peanut butter and apple jelly were the envy of the lunch trading economy. So, as we await the first touch of frost in the garden, and the temperature barely breaking the teens, it is time to sit in the introspection of fall with a nice juicy Mac and a

cup of hot chocolate with the smell of burning wood in the fireplaces wafting through the air signalling the official arrival of autumn. Happy Fall.

A Parish is:

"The Embodiment of the Kingdom of God"



When you think of what a Parish is, what comes to mind?

Generally we think of Parish as the people with whom we gather on Sundays and worship God, together. That happens to be only partially true. Sunday celebrations are when we celebrate God active in our lives, and where we are commissioned by God— 'Sent' into the world to bring the Kingdom of God to the world. It is *both*, not one or the other. Our Parish is also where we live out our Baptism. The Eucharist we become gets expressed in how we bring that understanding of being the Body of Christ to everything we say and do.

If such is the case, that means the growth and expression of the Parish is in truth, the growth and expression of the Kingdom of God in our midst.

To that end, we are inviting you to get involved in strengthening our expression as the Parish of St. Margaret of Scotland. Much of it rests on how you define "Parish", but the Church expresses in Sunday worship that "It is of the greatest importance that the celebration of the Mass... be so ordered the [faithful] may draw from it more abundantly those fruits which Christ instituted... (18) this will fittingly come about if, with due regard for the nature and other circumstances of each liturgical assembly, the entire celebration is arranged in such a way that it leads to a conscious, active, and full participation of

the faithful, namely in body and mind."

There are two important components to our expression of Eucharist that have been neglected over the years. We have so much focus and attention on Eucharist as a tangible thing. There is no other sacrament that can be reduced to merely 'a thing'. No one can give you a baptism, or reconciliation, or confirmation, or anointing, or marriage to hold in your hand. All of these are beyond words and items. Such also is the case with the Eucharist. It is relationship and encounter, and it is statement and affirmation. It is where the Christ meets us and we meet the Christ. It is where our truest self is given to us to remind us who we are. "Christian, remember your dignity..." Saint Pope Leo the Great.

This means that what we do and how we do it is vital for the 'salvation of the world.' Our baptism is a call to ministry! Our presence at Communion is a call to ministry! Our worship is a call to ministry! It is our hope that you will look deep within and answer the question of how I can bring the Kingdom of God a little bit closer to its fulfillment by my offering of my gifts to God in service of this Community.

In a world of individualism and selfishness, we need to be signs of 'unity and concord'.

Please consider how this community can be made better by your participation.


Ministers of Hospitality – meet & greet, opening doors, answering questions, welcoming

Extraordinary Ministers of Communion – as we have moved to




Altar servers – assisting the community by serving at the altar, so long as they have made their first communion and an option prerequisite – cheer for the Maple Leafs

<u>Catechesis Of the Good Shepherd (CGS)</u> <u>At St. Margaret's Church</u>

The catechesis of the Good Shepherd sessions take place in the "Atrium", a room prepared especially for the faith formation of children and youth as well as adults. The Atrium is directed by certified catechists who volunteer their time in service to the families of St. Margaret's parish.

Children will meet according to their age group and level after school. Sessions will be 1 1/2 to 2 hours long depending on the level. The schedule still needs to be finalized.

All Group Sessions will begin by the end of September or early October. Children new to the Atrium and their caregiver are welcomed to the Atrium for a visit before joining a group.

The cost for the year (end of September to end of May) is \$60 per child, \$100 for 2 children, \$140 for 3+ children.
