#### **Wavelengths**

I started school just at the end of the formal expectations. There was not a prescribed school uniform, but the recommended attire for the young boys was dark "slacks" and white buttoned-down shirt, and for the young girls, it was a tunic with a white blouse.

That uniform didn't last very long into my school career. I don't remember when it formally changed to a "come as you are" approach. Similarly, there was no official high school uniform, but the common practice was an Adidas t-shirt, Levis jeans, and ROM Adidas shoes. (The classic white shoe with three blue diagonal stripes.)

My prized t-shirts worn to impress was a lime coloured adidas shirt and a Beach Boys 'Endless Summer' T-shirt with a depiction of the 'Exhausted Indian' art installation. University fashions were simple. For our Sports Administration students, Laurentian Phys. Ed shorts and t-shirts and track pants were all the style. The great thing was that the shorts and shirt could be switched out for a new set, and the gym did the laundering.

In my family, style and fashion were not high priorities. Comfort and fit were the criteria we cared about over anything else. Sears was the big store of choice for shopping, and they usually had a sufficient selection, however, there were sections that I avoided – the old men's section. That included Arnold Palmer and Ben Hogan brands of pants and sweaters. They weren't out my price range, just out of my age bracket.

Whenever I saw them, I always thought of my grandfather with his old-man pants and sweaters and cardigans. I still remember the day when I was browsing through the displays I found something I liked. I tried it on and as I was trying to decide I saw that it was part of the "old man collection".

The shock was almost too much for me and so I left it in the changeroom lest someone I knew caught me with it. That was the date, a milestone of sorts that signaled a changing outlook. That was a long time ago and the definition of comfortable has expanded to include "warm". My younger blood was never much concerned with being warm, in fact defying the cold seemed to be a mark of Canadianship in mastering the Great White North.

Not much has changed except now wisdom has allowed that mastering the Great White North can include doing it while being warm. All these thoughts swirled around my head when at the CWL meeting, there was an unused sweater in my size on a search for a new home.

It may be that the recent cold snap arrived before my blood had taken on its winter thickness, but it looked cozy and warm, no matter if it was a granddad cardigan. I wore it the next day

and it was the first time I'd seen it in the mirror. It is great when form and function combine, and when youthful bravado gives way to practical wisdom. Toasty warm days ahead.
