

Anyway, New Year's was much too contrived for Dad. On occasion, we kids stayed up to welcome in the New Year, but there is no vivid recollection of it being a big deal. I do remember when we got our first colour television, there was an excitement about watching the Rose Bowl Parade in colour. That was so long ago.

When I think of New Year's Eve, my favorite of all was the year I was placed in a parish as a seminarian. By a long-convoluted twist, I was placed in Collingwood for the year. At the time, I was a skier and several of my friends from university had settled there. The plan was to arrive at one of the homes for dinner, then don our cross-country skis and meet the new year under the glow of the moon and stars.

A group of us headed out into the darkness of the fields and woods on that cold, crisp December night, filled with excitement and exuberance for the novelty of it all. It didn't take long before the giggles and frivolity gave way to silence. The stillness of the night, and the incredible spectacle of the stars, coaxed us into silence. (I would hazard a guess now that the silence would be exchanged for panting out of breath, but this was decades ago.) The silence resulted from the sheer beauty and awe of the night sky. Of course, we lost track of time and so when we did pause to usher in the new year, no one was sure if it was before or after. At that time, it just didn't matter, we were all transcended.

Eventually, with a great reluctance, it was time to head back. Back at the house, when conversations resumed and hot chocolate and mulled apple cider were served, we agreed that it was a perfect way to welcome the new year, this great mystical encounter. So, the host put on a Van Morrison song, and we quietly listened as Van immersed us back *"Into the Mystic"* which remains even today, one of my all-time favorite songs. Whenever I hear it, I am transported to the cold evening in the back fields somewhere in Collingwood, to the night when the separation between heaven and earth was very thin.


