Wavelengths

Some days I am up before the birds, well, in this winter season, perhaps up before the snowplows might be a better adage. Mostly it has to do with making it to the gym before the crowds start flowing in. On one of this week's dragging myself to the gym, there was a beautiful big-flaked snowfall happening, and with the crisp air it reminded me of watching my Dad build a skating rink out front our house. We were young, so our front yard was a perfect size for little feet to learn how to skate. There were a couple of children's chairs that served as supports as we learned how to skate. Eventually hockey sticks were added to the fray, and the most rudimentary style of hockey began. It was not unheard of for a shot with the puck to be followed by splaying out on the ice. We had a net at each end and lots of pucks got lost in snowbanks only to show up again in the spring melt. I am sure no one driving by watching would ever think he was witnessing a future NHL star or hall of famer. It was the era when sticks could be left outside drilled upright into a snowbank and they would still be there the next day. I am sure Mom was thankful because it kept the house a little cleaner, though four sets of skates plunked by the back door created its own obstacle course. The rink was situated in front of the kitchen windows from which Dad could sometimes hook up the hose and sit inside was he watered the rink instead of facing the cold nights of winter. I remember one particular day when we were out playing. Now we didn't wear any hockey gear. Equipment usually meant a warm tuque and mitts which could make stick handling a little tricky. When we warmed up enough, usually the gloves and coats got tossed onto the porch and we braved the elements in defiance of the cold. No one was worried about taking the puck off the shins because the skill or 'raising' the puck was likely years away. The strength and proficiency needed for such a skill were nowhere to be seen. That day though, I took a shot and it went through the kitchen window. That immediately ended the game and so with sullen faces and went inside waiting for the inevitable lecture and punishment. It seemed forever waiting for Dad to arrive from work. We heard the car drive up and the door open. Mom met him at the door, and we couldn't quite hear the conversation. We peeked around the corner with great fear and dread, and Dad came over. It looked like he had a bit of a smile on his face, a proud smile, and the first words out of his mouth were filled with excitement, 'You raised the puck?'. We didn't keep any shards of glass as a souvenir of the momentous event, but in Dad's eyes, I had become a hockey player. Then he went, bought a pane of glass and fixed the window. From that day on, we had to face the nets in the other direction.

Let us pray that children suffering from incurable diseases and their families, receive the necessary medical care and support, never losing strength and hope.


