Wavelengths

Coming from a hockey family, we spent an inordinate amount of time at hockey arenas, practices, backyard rinks, and ponds. There is a lot of hockey in these knees. There are a few memorable events that come to mind over the years. I distinctly remember playing with a cast on my left hand for a couple of weeks. Technically, it was against the rules, but let's face it, hockey is hockey. I remember the best hip-check I ever gave. Unfortunately, it was in a non-contact league, and I got two minutes for it – but so worth it though.

There was an unfortunate episode where I took a slapshot to ice the puck and it went over the boards and hit a young kid sitting on top of the penalty box boards. The puck shattered his cheek bone, and he lost his left eye. I met that kid years later when he started at my high school. I remember playing with the Flying Fathers. I was on a breakaway with a left-winger, and I got the pass with a wide-open net. I leaned in and delivered the hardest shot I had ever had. I know this because of the sound of it hitting the boards- I had missed the wide-open net—much to my disappointment, but more to my embarrassment.

We played almost every Friday at the seminary, and that is how Fridays came to be my day off. But by far, the most enjoyment I ever had on the blades was playing intermural hockey at university. Our residence had two teams that played in the leagues, and the games usually began at 9 pm at night and the late game would end at 1 pm. The arena was off-campus, so we would pile into cars – no seat belts, people crammed into the front and back as only university students would do, and head to the game.

Once, when we were the late game, an ice storm came through. The roads were pure ice. Coming outside and trying to drive the car was impossible. We thought of donning our skates and skating home. We ended up slip-sliding along the road heading back to residence. It was about 4:00 am when we made it home. Instead of going to bed, we stayed up chatting in the communal kitchen about our adventure that night. It seemed to bond us together more tightly, and we sat there making toasted peanut butter sandwiches. Of course, the University was shut down with the ice storm, but still, those early bird keeners were shocked when they came to start their mornings and we were spoiling their usual peace and tranquility. They had no appreciation or care about our adventures. This memory arises every time I have toasted peanut butter sandwiches and to be honest, it is really the only game over the years that I remember the score – we had played the best team in the league, had only one extra person on the bench, and we held them to a tie, 3 to 3.

The whole adventure was a win and a memory.
