Visiting classrooms can be a lot of fun – except maybe kindergarten. Whenever I am standing outside their door, the threatening music of “Jaws” goes through my head. For sure, they are cute, but they are too unpredictable and off in their own worlds. I remember the teacher asking the children if they remembered my name and one little gaffer put up her hand. When asked what she remembered me, all she said was “I have a dog”’. (Wow, what a great ego-boost! Not sure what to do with that.)

Anyway, they should have a Hallmark Card that celebrates, “I survived the kindergarten classroom!” Usually, I get the standard questions about my favorite food, my favorite colour, mundane things that only students trying to avoid math class can be interested in. In the early days another popular question was how old I was. I used to ask them to guess and usually I was way younger than they guessed, and it was all in great fun. Now it is a toss-up. I am vainly thrilled when they under-guess, but the over-guesses stab at the heart. Do I really look 90?


In the old days, I loved the response that I was younger than their parents. Now the risk is that I am older than their grandparents. Ouch, but likely true! Eventually we get around to schools, and I will ask them what they thought I studied at university. Answers range from religion or math or my favorite, “priest stuff”. They are shocked when I admit that I studied Sports Administration, and they are intrigued that I wanted to work for the Olympics.

That naturally leads into conversations about my favorite sports that I played or my favorite sports teams. Once, a priest friend of my brother was coming to visit us in 1984. The original date fell through, so a second date was arranged that coincided with the opening of the Los Angeles Summer Games in 1984. Despite my vehement protests, the date stood and early in the afternoon a car pulled up, and a real-life Monsignor got out of the car. I had not told anyone of my plans to enter the seminary and to be honest, I was rather distant, maybe a bit effacing and totally unengaging, despite the numerous attempts to be brought into the conversation. I think I knew exactly how long it was until the opening ceremonies were to begin. So, the afternoon dragged on. Then after supper around 6:15, the Monsignor said that he didn't want to be rude, but would it be possible to turn the television on because he always watched the Olympics. Before he finished his sentence, I was up and had the television on in a flash! (This was in the days before remote controls.) I had a noticeable change in disposition after that. I still think my brother orchestrated the whole thing. I didn't care, so we sat there watching the parade of athletes and I was much more engaged in the conversations.

Moral of the story: the Olympics are on and no one is allowed to get sick, want an anointing, or die.


